

COVID 19 ANNEX to WBSGS Child Protection Policy

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1. Supplementary safeguarding measures for period of school closure from Monday 23rd March

Designated Safeguarding leads will be available during normal working hours over the period of closure. Staff, parent and students have been made aware of this availability and given relevant contact details.

On Friday 20th March, Safeguarding leads at WBSGS rang up all the parents/carers of students in the government's published list of categories of 'vulnerable' student to discuss whether parents and students wished to attend school during the period of closure. In the case of students with a social worker/Children's Services plans, contact was also made with the relevant social worker to discuss. Following subsequently published guidance, Risk Assessments have been completed for all EHCP students.

In the week before school closure, safeguarding and pastoral leaders constructed a list of vulnerable students who we wished to systematically monitor and maintain contact with over the period of closure.

There are 63 students on this list (which may of course expand during the closure).

A member of staff, predominantly SLT Pastoral leads and Heads of Year, has been allocated to each student to maintain primary contact and supervision over the period of closure.

Primary contacts have been given the guideline of making contact with each student and/or parent (as appropriate) once per week, but to vary that according to need/risk.

Contact is being made by email in the first instance. Issues or non-responses are reported to the Safeguarding leads to follow up, including by telephone.

All contacts are recorded on a shared google sheet for overall monitoring with weekly review of that record by Safeguarding Leads.

The school counsellor is maintaining her counselling appointments by telephone and acts as the primary contact for some of these students. The independent Safespace counselling service is also continuing, via telephone.

Our South West Herts Partnership Family Worker continues to work with a number of our most vulnerable families and also acts as the primary contact for some of these students.

All students and parents have been informed of other relevant wellbeing services which are available, such as kooth.com

2. Protocol for safer online working

Within the School

Outside of the school

Lockdown offers greater challenges for keeping children safe when the majority of their work is conducted or accessed via online systems. To mitigate these problems the school uses the following protocol.

Staff

Staff have been issued with a detailed protocol about how to conduct teaching and learning when students can not physically come to the school. This details the way in which staff should interact and contact pupils and their parents. In all cases staff should use their school accounts when communicating with the school community.

There is no expectation that staff will conduct live online lessons, however should they wish to they

In our communication with parents and carers, we have emphasised the importance of securing online support from a reputable organisation/individual who can provide evidence that they are safe and can be trusted to have access to children.
